

Morning Church!

For 70 years, Queen Elizabeth, served as the head of the British monarchy. In May, her son, Prince Charles of Wales succeeds her as King Charles III. There are 43 monarchies in the world. This governance structure is so different from our three-branched system of “checks and balances”.

Pius XI established The Feast of Christ the King in 1925 in response to the viciousness of Mussolini’s Fascist Party. Pius XI wanted to promote the sovereignty of Christ over the anarchy of military force and its human chaos. He called all believers to actively participate in this feast and to imitate Christ’s servant-leadership.

Today, Royals oversee the temporal, temporary realm. Their privileged lives give them access to excesses and they seem to want for nothing. The pomp and circumstance of inaugurations, state dinners, and many other perks, set them apart from the ordinary lives of their the citizens they are called to serve.

In this Year of Grace, we viewed Christ’s life through Luke’s lens. In Jesus’ Inaugural Address he quoted Isaiah,

*The spirit of God is upon me, for God
has anointed me to bring glad tidings
to the poor, and sent me to proclaim liberty
to captives, recovery of sight to the blind,
to let the oppressed go free,
and to proclaim a year of favor from God.*

Servant-leadership means the inclusive love of your Dear Neighbors. It means embracing them with mercy and compassion as Jesus did. The humble “washing of their feet” takes different shapes and forms. It’s never a “one size fits all” ministry.

Servant-leadership demands *loving inclusion of all people*: sinners, outcasts, women, children, foreigners, tax collectors, those who are broken in mind, body or spirit, those who are poor, Gentiles, and enemies.

From his Throne of the Cross, Jesus showed us that servant-leaders lay down their lives for others. In his life of service, The King completed his mission and kept every promise made in his Inaugural Address.

No one would have viewed The Crucified Christ as a king or his Crown of Thorns as royal coronet. During his three hours of agony, our King continued to model The Way. He showed no resentment or anger towards those who ridiculed him. Jesus promised Paradise to a repentant thief who’d professed his faith in him.

Faithful followers of the King live this feast every day by being servant-leaders in his name. They strive to love *every Neighbor* in God’s Neighborhood.

Meditate on the image of Christ Crucified with his arms outstretched and made immovable by nails. He is visible vulnerability. His extended arms lovingly and painfully embrace all of Creation.

The letter to the Colossians proclaims
Christ who holds all things together,
forgives all things,
reconciles all things,
and loves all of us
unconditionally.

~ this is the grace of servant-leadership.

Pray to Christ the King that one day,
you too, may be with him in Paradise.

that in spring he may be a lover of joy and in winter a lover of wisdom."

"And when you make a mistake, start over. Because only then will you be in love with life.
You'll discover that being happy isn't having a perfect life.
But use tears to irrigate tolerance.
Use your defeats to train your patience."

"Use your mistakes with the serenity of the sculptor. Use pain to tune into pleasure.
Use obstacles to open the windows of intelligence. Never give up ...
Above all never give up on the people that love you.
Never give up on being happy, because life is an incredible spectacle."


Before He died, Jesus said that His kingdom was not in this world. Do you know where Jesus' kingdom is?

Make sure you do something special today to celebrate the feast of Christ the King!


