Morning Church!

Previously in the Book of Maccabees, Eleazar, gives a dramatic witness of faith in the "living eternal God". Refusing to eat the forbidden flesh, he is martyred. Today, the Maccabean brothers and their mother, are put to the same test. With deep faith in God and eternal life, they too, are martyred for rejecting the king's demands.

God's Law is meant to lead us to follow God's Will. The Law is not meant to make us legalistic, scrupulous, fanatical, or fearful of punishment. The Law can only "keep" us if we live it in Love.

In the gospel, the Sadducees, Jewish fundamentalists who don't believe in the resurrection, set a philosophical trap for Jesus. He answers their question with an argument-ending response: since you don't understand our God is a God of the living, and not of the dead, you will never be able to grasp the meaning of resurrection and eternal life.

Jesus taught us the life to come is hinged to the life we live here-and-now. Married or unmarried, we struggle to make loving choices each day. We trust Love will keep us as we make our way Home. We believe God's promise of eternal life is given to all who are faithful unto death. Let us pray for one another that we experience God's love here-and-now and in the here-after, too.

Be wary of any temptation to see the gospel separating married from the unmarried, and the living from the dead. That's where our eyes and heads try to take us at first read. Do Christ's words discriminate or contradict his mission. No, Christ is always The Includer, The Reconciler with a sense of the Big Picture.

This gospel, as all Scripture, has a much deeper meaning than you get with one read. All people are called to live without making persons, or things into "gods" or ultimates. Married or not, all of us long for completion. Jesus is says our present life leads to the beyond — not to itself. Sometimes our deep longings lead us to drift into a greedy grasping of anyone or anything as a substitute for oru relationship with God.

Reflect on the Marriage Vow formula. Its words are much, much bigger than they seem and are related to the Covenant God made with you at Baptism. "My Covenant is my forever, faithful commitment with and for you." This Covenant, like the Great Command is a dual relationship. It is not a mere contract, a conditioned, changeable, and temporary agreement. It is an eternal bond of love. Loving and honoring is what the God of the Living is all about — so we, married or unmarried — are to do the same. The where and how of our earthly life is just a blink of the eye.

As we anticipate the midterm vote, let's remember our promise to God and our Dear Neighbor: "...to be true to each other in good times and in bad, in sickness and health, to love and honor each other all the days of our lives."

Christ's gospel makes life and responsibilities much, much bigger and meaningful...that's a Promise.

unexpected revelation from God.


Jesus' life deepened their awareness of God's unconditional love for them.




When we are small there are things that we like to do, like playing with toys, that we won't like as much when we get bigger. As we get older, different things make us happy, but


